- Greek Allies went on the road this spring hosting conversations at 9 different chapters across all of the Greek councils, some of which were attended by upwards of 40 students
- Conversation topics focused on gender norms reinforced at parties, Women's History Month, toxic masculinity, drag culture and much more

Greek Allies invites students to bring both their knowledge of advocacy/allyship as well as their experience of membership within a fraternity or sorority. Students are then provided the opportunity to talk about the intersectionality of these through peer-to-peer interaction.
