More than 95% of respondents indicated they feel confident following alcohol serving guidelines, checking IDs, providing sober monitors, and intervening in unsafe situations following social host training.

HOW MIGHT YOU RESPOND TO AN INTOXICATED STUDENT IN NEED?

"Go over and see if they are okay / how intoxicated they are. If underage or very intoxicated I would call LUPD for medical amnesty."

"I would help them and ask if they were with any friends if the person wasn't responding well to get more information."

"Help them get home safely. If they are too intoxicated then I would call LUPD to help."

FUTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

During the spring 2017 semester, we saw an increase in high risk drinking behavior on our campus. Multiple students were found alone and needing serious medical attention.

Outside of the assessment, multiple student leaders have not demonstrated an understanding of intervening or personal liability. Next year, we must approach this from a personal, practical lens to prevent the "not me" mindset. We might also consider extending our reach beyond the three groups of leaders.
