### Learning Outcomes

### Biggest vulnerability to risk

**IFC** 100% of respondents said "Serving underage students" and 66.67% said "Not IDing attendees" and "Uncontrolled access to alcohol"

**CGC** There were no new officers that needed to be trained for our CGC chapters in the spring 2018 semester

**Panhel** 64.29% of respondents said "Serving underage students" and 50% said "Drinking games"

Implications

It seems more people were willing to recognize the impact of serving underage students than fall 2017. However, half of the respondents still do not believe their chapter needs to make a change. This confirms that we need to focus our attention on instilling the need and capacity for change in our future leaders.
