The Draft Book was used as a tool to help students reflect on and connect the various parts of their first semester to **bLUeprint** foundations and shared common experiences such as Orientation, residence hall living, 5x10 series lectures, and the EvoLUtion seminar, etc.

Students gave feedback about the usefulness and medium offered (workbook) for this reflection. Overall, students were confused about the difference between the Draft Book and the **bLUeprint**.

A few students understood that the Draft Book was a place to reflect and house the **bLUeprint**, which was more of a plan for their time at Lehigh.



Discussed benefits to having a tangible hard copy reflection medium (i.e., Draft Book). *Two comments were...* 

"If it was on a website, I am pretty sure no one would run across it again."

"I liked having a hard copy to keep track of my thoughts." Students were also asked about the implementation process and methods that accompanied the roll out of **bLUeprint** to provide insight for the implementation committee on the most effective ways to integrate **bLUeprint** as a curriculum into the student experience.
