1.	Gamma Phi Beta Sorority	February 5, 2026	Two new members of Gamma Phi Beta Sorority were transported to St. Luke's for an alcohol overdose on the same night. Because the events occurred on the same evening a hazing investigation was undertaken by the Office of Student Conduct & Community Standards. The investigation did not develop any evidence of hazing. No charges were filed related to hazing, the chapter was educated on issues related to alcohol and alcohol abuse.	N/A	February 25, 2026
2	Chi Phi Fraternity	February 12, 2026	Lehigh University Police responded to Chi Phi Fraternity for a trouble alarm. Upon arrival they found multiple students in the basement of the house half dressed. There was alcohol present and the floors were wet. Students failed to comply with university officials when told to stay in the basement. Investigation by University Police and the Office of Student Conduct & Community occurred. The chapter was charged with and accepted responsibility for charges related to hazing, interfering with university activities, conduct which endangers the health and safety of others, causing an emergency, providing false information to university officials, and various alcohol related charges. The chapter was placed on Disciplinary Deferred Dissolution through May 16, 2027, and Disciplinary Probation through December 2027. The chapters ability to host events with alcohol is curtailed during the Fall 2026 semester and the Spring 2027 semester, the chapter is required to develop a new member program that meets university standards, and the chapter is required to develop a year long educational curriculum covering topics decided on by the university, the alums, and the national office,	April 27, 2026	May 11, 2026

3	Alpha Epsilon Pi	May 16, 2026	Lehigh University Police received an anonymous report by a graduating senior that over the course of the Spring 2026 semester she and her roommates heard various noises coming from a nearby off campus house. The report indicated that things such “get down on your hands and knees, stay in position, and you guys are in trouble” were heard on non-specified dates during the course of the Spring 2026 semester. An investigation was conducted by the Office of Student Conduct & Community Expectations. The residents of the house in question were no longer members of Alpha Epsilon Pi and denied any involvement with any Alpha Epsilon Pi new members. The chapter president and alumni advisor were interviewed and also denied that any new member events were held at that location. There was no evidence to corroborate the report and no charges were filed.	N/A	May 22, 2026
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
