 - Lehigh University expects that all students will act in a manner that reflects personal and intellectual honesty.

Academic Integrity

• Why is it important?

- Ideas are important and people should get credit for their ideas.
- Part of your education is being evaluated on your work. To properly evaluate your work, your instructors need to know it is **YOURS**.
- Ideas are a form of currency in an academic environment.

General Tips

Do your own work.

When you use other people's ideas cite their work.

Do your assignments as assigned.

Ask for help when you need it.

Cheating on an Exam:

- Bringing a "cheat sheet" to an exam.
- Looking off another student's exam.
- Programming your calculator in a prohibited manner.
- Having someone take an exam for you.

Using unauthorized sources:

- Using the solutions manual on homework assignments.
- Using a paper/project turned in by another student in a previous semester.
- Using a source on a take home exam that is not permitted.

Falsifying Grades:

- Resubmitting an exam for re-grading after you make changes.
- Submitting late work and claiming it was on-time.
- Attempts to access electronic grades.

Falsifying Data:

- Ocopying someone else's date in a lab.
- Using another student's spreadsheets in a business class.

• Collusion:

- Giving someone your homework to look at.
- Allowing another student to see work you did in a class without permission of the instructor.
- Working with a student on computer code (if you are not allowed)
- Cheating on an exam with another student's assistance.

• Plagiarism:

- Copying a pasting from a source without citation.
- Rewording (Paraphrasing) without citation.
- Having someone write a paper for you.
- Turning in the same paper in two different classes.
