What can I expect from the Health & Wellness Center?

- High quality, compassionate medical care for ALL eligible undergraduate and graduate students.
- Non-judgmental care that respects individual differences in a confidential environment.
- Our dedicated, professional staff offers a host of services, including acute care, immunizations, lab services, gynecological examinations and contraceptive counseling.
- Goal helping our students stay healthy in pursuit of academic success, and in fostering the public health of the campus community.

Is there a cost for the Health & Wellness Center?

- NO fee for most visits, including those with a Registered Nurse, Certified Registered Nurse Practitioner and/or Physician trained to take care of your medical situation or concern through assessment, diagnosis, and treatment.
- Modest fee for prescription medications, vaccinations, supplies and laboratory testing, reimbursable with University's Student Health Insurance Plan.



Medications

- If you are currently taking medication, please be sure to plan ahead for future supply.
- Providers at the Health & Wellness Center can prescribe most medications that may be needed, however certain medications need to be prescribed by a specialist and are not prescribed by our providers.

Many medications, including over-the-counter samples, are available at the Health & Wellness Center.

APPOINTMENT ONLY

- During the academic semesters:
 - Monday-Thursday: 8:15 am 4:15 pm
 - Friday: 9:15 am 4:15 pm
 - Saturday & Sunday: Closed
- Hours may vary during breaks.
- After hours support:
 - Even when the Health & Wellness Center is closed, by calling our main number (610-758-3870), students can get in touch with a Triage Registered Nurse for health issues that are non-urgent, and cannot wait until the next day.

• Our no show policy is available online to view.

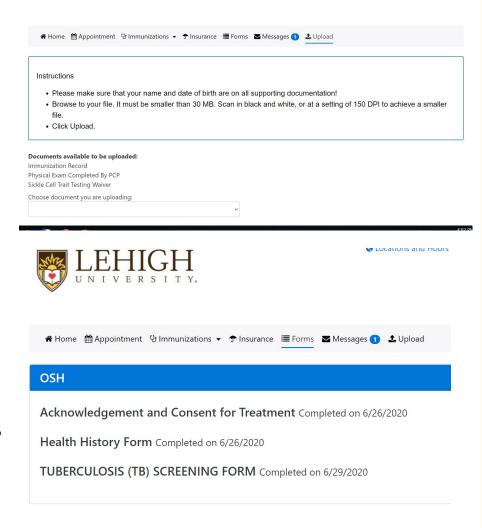
• If you no show for an appointment a \$20 charge will be added to your Bursar account.

"I feel sick"

- Call HWC at 610.758.3870, give a brief summary of illness to schedule an appointment.
- Allow 30 minutes for your appointment.
- Arrive at HWC 10-15 minutes before your scheduled appointment.
- RN/MA will start your exam with vitals and any indicated in-house testing.

- MD/DO/NP will complete exam, along with recommendations.
- Most medications can be dispensed at time of visit for a modest fee.



"I fell one evening and now have a swollen ankle"

- Call HWC at 610.758.3870, give a brief summary of the injury to schedule an appointment.
- Allow 30 minutes for your appointment.
- Arrive at HWC 10-15 minutes before your scheduled appointment.
- RN/MA will start your exam with vitals.
- MD/DO/NP will complete exam, along with recommendations.

- If indicated, x-rays can be ordered to be done at the local hospital.

 Tests ordered are billed directly to student insurance.
- Lyft code will be provided for transportation if needed.



"I wake up feeling sick on a Saturday morning"

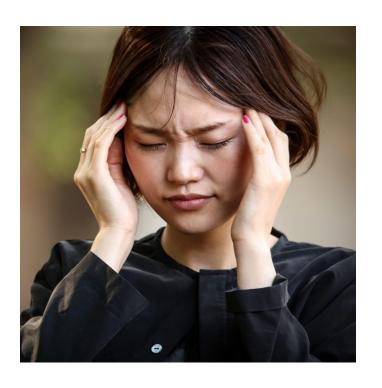
- If unsure if symptoms are urgent, call 610.758.3870 to be prompted to connect with Triage Registered Nurse from local hospital for further guidance.
- If only mildly ill and able to sleep, call HWC at 610.758.3870 after 8:15am, Monday thru Friday, for a same day appointment.

In the case you are having a medical emergency while the Health & Wellness Center is closed, please take one of the following actions:

- •If you are on Lehigh's campus, call the Lehigh University Campus Safety at: 610-758-4200
- •If you are not on Lehigh's campus, call the Police Department at: 911

- Call HWC at 610.758.3870 to schedule an appointment.
- Advise staff of the onset of your symptoms and any previous treatments you have tried.
- Medications can be dispensed from HWC or sent to local pharmacy.
- Other indicated treatments or testing can be ordered and coordinated by the provider at HWC.

Establish Care

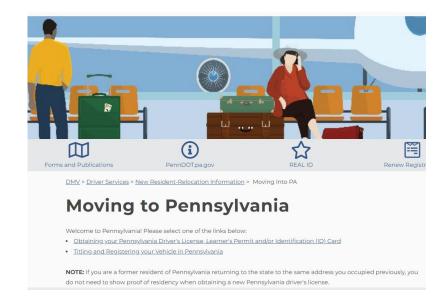
- Pre-existing health conditions, daily medications, routine gynecological care, etc...

- Advise staff of any gender preference for your provider.
- Medications can be dispensed from HWC or sent to local pharmacy.

 insurance.



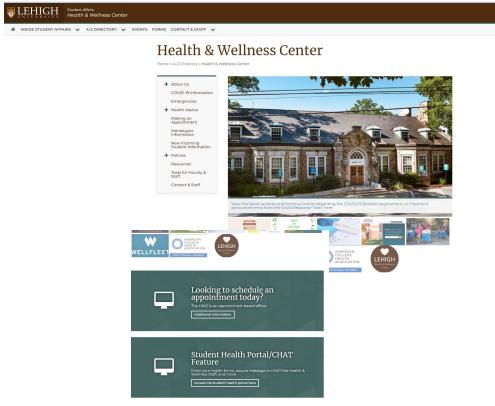
Driver's License Exam

Lehigh University 2025-2026 Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) Overview

General SHIP Information

All Lehigh International Students on an F-1 or J-1 Visa, regardless of the number of registered credits, are not permitted to drop coverage by submitting a waiver form unless they have parents or a spouse/domestic partner living and/or working in the U.S. and are covered under a family plan that's ACA-compliant, they are sponsored to study at Lehigh by their home country or U.S. government that provides them with an insurance plan, or they have dependents at Lehigh and have a private family insurance plan that's ACA-compliant.

International students should contact Lehigh's Office of International Students & Scholars (610) 758-4859 to verify if they qualify for a waiver.

- Insurance Company: Wellfleet Insurance Company
- Annual Premium: \$2,745
- Policy Period: 8/15 8/14 for annual coverage
 - Students who do not plan to attend Lehigh for Spring 2026 are eligible to enroll in Fall Only coverage.

Insurance Terms and Definitions

- **Deductible:** The cost you may have to pay for certain covered services you receive during your annual coverage period before benefits are paid by the health plan.
 - SHIP Deductible*: \$50 In-Network, \$50 Out-of-Network
 - * waived for services rendered at the Student Health Center and services referred by the Student Health Center
- Copay: The fixed dollar amount you may have to pay for a covered service, usually when you receive the covered service.
 - SHIP Prescription Drug Copays: Tier 1: \$10 copay, Tier 2, 3, and specialty: 20% coinsurance
- Coinsurance: The percentage you may have to pay for a covered service.
 - **SHIP coinsurance**: In general, the student is responsible for 5% of the negotiated charges for services when seeing an In-Network provider and 15% of the usual and customary charges for services when seeing an Out-of-Network provider.
- Out-of-Pocket Maximum: Your out-of-pocket maximum is the most that you could pay during a plan year for deductible on Proprietary & Confidential consymments, and coinsurance for covered services.

Voluntary Dental and Vision Insurance

- Students are not enrolled unless form and payment submitted online
- Dental Insurance
 - Insurance Company: United Concordia Flex PPO Dental
 - Annual Coverage Period: 9/1 -8/31
 - Annual Premium: \$555 for student, \$1,569 for student + 1 or more dependents
 - Annual Deadline to Enroll: 8/15
- Vision Insurance
 - Insurance Company: VSP Vision Care
 - Annual Coverage Period: 9/1 8/31
 - Annual Premium: \$196 for student, \$550 for student + 1 or more dependents
 - Annual Deadline to Enroll: 8/15

Access important health plan information

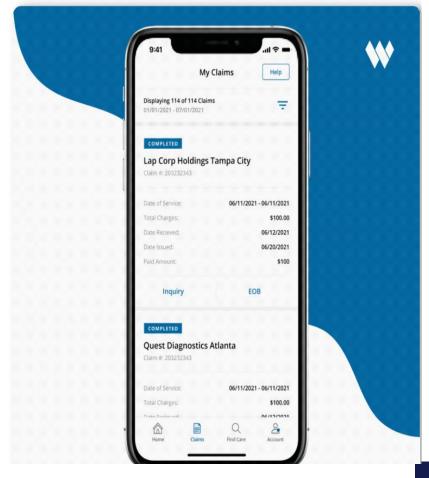
Easily review benefit information, discover pharmacy benefits, and access additional plan resources.
