## **Academic & Intellectual Advancement**

- Pi Beta Phi was ranked second out of eight Panhellenic Sororities in the fall 2018 semester with a GPA of 3.50, an increase of 0.15 from the spring 2018 semester. The 3.50 GPA placed the chapter above the All Greek and All Sorority average.
- Pi Beta Phi was ranked fourth out of eight Panhellenic Sororities in the spring 2019 semester with a GPA of 3.45, a decrease of 0.05 from the fall 2018 semester. The 3.45 GPA placed the chapter above the All Sorority and All Greek average.
- Pi Beta Phi's spring 2019 new member class GPA was 3.21 ranking fourth out of eight Panhellenic Sororities.
- Pi Beta Phi had 46.9% of the chapter on the Dean's List in the fall 2018 semester and 42.9% on the Dean's List in the spring 2019 semester.
- The committee commends the chapter's academic incentive programs.
- Pi Beta Phi hosted an academic workshop with Katherine Cimei, who is an alumnae who works in the Center for Academic Success at Lehigh University.
