## Welcome to Lehigh!

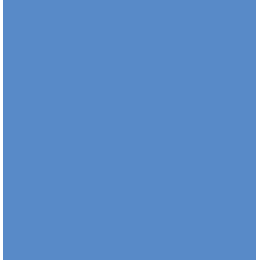
In just a few months you will join the rest of the Class of 2030, and we cannot wait to meet you! Our goal is to provide you with information to assist in your transition to Lehigh.

## GETTING STARTED

As a new student, there are a few things you need to complete before August. We call it your Summer Checklist. Make sure you complete these items (and not your mom, brother or cousin, even though they may be tempted to help you out). Finishing these tasks on your own, or with a little guidance from us, will help you in the event you have a question when you arrive in the fall. Trust us. We have done this before.

### ■ CONNECT LEHIGH

Connect Lehigh ([connect.lehigh.edu](https://connect.lehigh.edu)) is your one-stop-shop for Lehigh information. To log in, use your Lehigh computing account credentials, the six-character username (e.g., abc123) and the password you established after you were admitted. If you haven't created your Lehigh computing account, go to the Applicant Student Portal and click on the link "Establish your Lehigh Account." If you need assistance, please contact the Information Technology Services Help Desk at 610-758-HELP (4357). On **Tuesday, May 12**, you will be given access to new information in Connect Lehigh that will be helpful to you in your transition and throughout your college experience.

### ■ SUMMER CHECKLIST

The Summer Checklist is designed to help you keep track of the tasks you need to complete before your arrival. You can check off items as you go and ensure you don't miss any important deadlines. On pages 2 and 3 are a few notes regarding specific checklist items. This is not a complete list! Log into Connect Lehigh for a complete list and to view item deadlines. The checklist will include informational links, required surveys, forms, and contracts. International students will complete an additional pre-arrival checklist through iHome. You should have received this information from the Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS), and questions can be directed to [intnl@lehigh.edu](mailto:intnl@lehigh.edu).

### ■ LEHIGH EMAIL

On Tuesday, May 12, your Lehigh Gmail account will be made available at [lehigh.edu/google](https://lehigh.edu/google). All official university communication will ONLY be sent to your Lehigh email! Your Lehigh email address will be your username@lehigh.edu. To login you will utilize the same credentials you do for your portal. In addition to receiving your new Lehigh Gmail account, you will need to enroll in Duo multi factor authentication via the Duo Enrollment Page. **Be sure to complete the entire process outlined in How to Enroll in Duo, at [go.lehigh.edu/studentduoguide](https://go.lehigh.edu/studentduoguide), in one sitting.** Abandoning the process will prevent you from being able to access Lehigh's resources. If you have questions regarding your Lehigh Gmail account, contact the ITS Help Desk.



#### ■ THE LEHIGH PASS

Your **Lehigh Pass** is a mobile credential that identifies you as a member of the Lehigh community. **Lehigh Pass** grants you access to your residence hall, academic buildings, athletic events, your meal plan, Clutch Cash account and more. You'll receive more details this summer regarding how to upload your photo and create your **Lehigh Pass** right on your phone.

#### ■ STUDENT HEALTH INFORMATION

Visit the checklist for links to the 2026-2027 health forms required to be completed by your health-care provider. You will need to upload them to your student health portal, and complete any electronic forms, enroll in or waive Lehigh's student health insurance plan & upload a picture of your health insurance card. International students must enroll in Lehigh's student health insurance plan.

#### ■ CREATE YOUR LINC ACCOUNT

LINC is a "virtual campus center" and the primary location for the Lehigh community to learn about student involvement opportunities. You can search clubs and organizations, print your involvement transcript, and find campus events, so create your account now. Instructions are available on the Summer Checklist.

#### ■ LEHIGH LIBRARIES

Lehigh Libraries support your research and academic success, providing books, databases, e-journals, ebooks, course materials, and expert help. See [go.lehigh.edu/itsintro](https://go.lehigh.edu/itsintro).

#### ■ INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

Information Technology Services (ITS) support your technology needs, offering networking, computing labs, software, printing, and a Help Desk. See [go.lehigh.edu/itsintro](https://go.lehigh.edu/itsintro).

#### ■ PACKING LIST

The Summer Checklist links this helpful packing list including what to bring and what not to bring. **If you are shipping items to campus, please note the Mail Center cannot accept packages until August.** Your mailing address will be sent to you over the summer and can be found in your banner account when it is assigned and available.

#### ■ GET CONNECTED

Meet your Orientation Leaders, stay on top of deadlines, and get an inside look at what's happening at Lehigh by checking out our social media. ## LIVE LEHIGH

Every student who lives on campus Lives Lehigh. Your residence hall is more than a place to sleep, study, and spend time between classes — it is where your Lehigh experience begins to take shape. It is where you will build meaningful relationships, explore and express your identities, and learn from others whose experiences may differ from your own.

Each residential offering provides unique opportunities to connect, influenced by building design, traditions, and living options. As you consider your preferences, think about the kind of environment that will help you thrive. Community does not happen by accident; it is built through small, everyday moments. So meet the person next door. Talk with your Gryphon. Share a meal. Start the conversation. It's time for your residential experience to begin.

### How to Sign Up for Housing

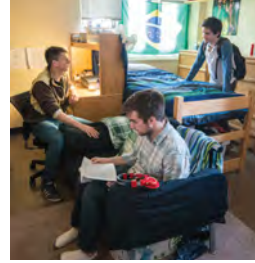
Check your Summer Checklist **June 4th** for the link to complete your housing contract. The housing contract is due **June 19th**.

**STEP 1:** Review the housing options outlined below and rank your preferences carefully. Detailed descriptions of residence halls are available at [go.lehigh.edu/fyshousing](https://go.lehigh.edu/fyshousing). Take time to consider the environment in which you will feel most supported and successful. While we make every effort to honor preferences, all assignments are based on availability.

- **Themed Communities:** Indicate any themed communities you are interested in. If you do not select a themed community — or if space is no longer available — you will be assigned to another available housing option.
- **Single Room Request:** If you prefer to live independently, you may request a single room. Please note that single rooms are limited and not guaranteed. If a single is not available, you will be assigned a roommate.
- **Gender Configuration:** Select the gender configuration(s) in which you would feel most comfortable living (e.g., all-gender, co-ed by floor/wing, or co-ed by building).

**STEP 2:** Choose your meal plan (see page 8 for more details!)

**STEP 3:** Use the roommate matching module to complete your roommate matching profile, interact with other students, and connect with your roommate.



### Themed Communities

Joining a themed community offers the opportunity to build meaningful connections around something that matters to you — whether that is an academic interest, cultural identity, shared experience, or personal passion. These connections often become the foundation for lasting friendships and deeper involvement on campus. Each themed community is supported by professional staff who partner with student leaders to create programs, events, and conversations connected to the community's focus. Our first-year themed communities are open to all incoming students and are designed to help you start your Lehigh experience with intention.

#### CHOICE

A community for students who choose to live a healthy and substance-free lifestyle in a fun and engaging environment. Through various activities and interactions, members foster an environment that promotes well-being and personal growth while enjoying a social atmosphere.



#### Creative Arts

A community for students who are passionate about the arts, including visual arts, music, theater, and writing. Members of these communities have the opportunity to collaborate on creative projects, attend performances, and showcase their work.



#### First Gen

A community which provides additional resources and support to those students who identify as first generation college students. Through purposefully tailored programs and events, First Gen residents begin creating connections that will allow them to excel during their time at Lehigh.



#### Global Lehigh

A community of domestic and international students interested in exploring cultural learning, and who want to enhance their understanding of cultures different from their own through events, meals, guest speakers, film, and more. Students will connect with Lehigh resources such as the Office of International Students and Scholars, Study Abroad, and the Iacocca Institute.



#### Sylvia Rivera Community

Grounded in the spirit of Sylvia Rivera, who dedicated her life to supporting queer and trans liberation, this community seeks to further connect residents to the LGBTQIA+ community at Lehigh and within the greater Lehigh Valley area. This community will learn from and celebrate the history and culture, as well as explore the future of the queer liberation movement that Sylvia dedicated her life to support.





### STEM

A community for students who want to immerse themselves in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics outside of their classroom academic experience in order to further develop the skills necessary to become leaders in the field. Members can collaborate on projects, attend events, and explore career opportunities in STEM fields. The STEM community is supported by faculty and peer-to-peer mentorship.



### UMOJA

UMOJA, which means “unity” in Swahili, is a space that allows residents to develop a sense of community through a shared exploration of diversity and multiculturalism. The UMOJA House serves as an inclusive center for mentorship and support on-campus and has been a centerpiece of the residential community at Lehigh for over thirty years. This is a community where upper and first-year students live together.



### Inter-College

A community of students in Inter-College (IC) programs who are keen to deepen their understanding of interdisciplinary education and research through social and intellectual engagement with other IC students. This is a community where upper and first-year students live together.



### Room Details

Most residence hall rooms are shared doubles, but there are also a limited number of singles and triples. Each room has a bed with a mattress, desk & chair, dresser or built-in drawers, and a closet or wardrobe. Wireless internet access is available throughout all residence halls in both bedrooms and common areas. Within the residence halls, common areas include lounges, kitchens, study rooms, laundry rooms and game rooms. Vending machines are also located in each residence hall.

While you cannot choose the building you live in, you can see what housing options exist. We recommend visiting [go.lehigh.edu/fyshousing](http://go.lehigh.edu/fyshousing) after you receive your assignment in July. You can learn about the unique features of your residence hall, the furniture that will be provided in your room, and you can take a virtual walk through what your new room looks like. You can also see available measurements to help you with planning for your living space.

## Arrival Information

### FIRST-YEAR STUDENT CHECK-IN:

Thursday, August 20, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at Iacocca Hall

*In order to pick up your residence hall room key, you will need a government-issued photo ID to confirm identity. Driver's license, state ID or passport will be accepted.*



## Housing and Roommate Selection

Lehigh assigns rooms based on desired housing and programmatic preferences. A random process will be utilized to determine your housing assignment along with others who have made similar selections.

You will use the roommate matching module to complete your roommate matching profile, interact with other students, and connect with your roommate. All matches must be completed by June 19th. If you have not matched with a roommate, during the housing assignment process you will be matched with a roommate using the information you provide on the roommate matching module. If you request a student and they also request you, you will automatically be placed together whenever possible.

All first-year students are required to live on campus, but you may petition Housing Services for exemption for the following reasons:

- You are 22 years of age or older
- You reside with a parent or legal guardian within a 30-mile radius of Lehigh University
- You are married
- One or more dependents live with you

If you qualify and would like to petition, go to [go.lehigh.edu/exemption](https://go.lehigh.edu/exemption) and submit your petition by June 9th.

Be sure to check your Lehigh email for your housing and roommate information in July!

## Live-In Staff

### Gryphons

At Lehigh, Resident Assistants/Advisors are known as Gryphons — named after the mythical creature that guarded the gold of ancient Scythia. Since 1957, the Gryphon Society has played an essential role in supporting first-year students as they transition to the academic and social life of the University. Gryphons are upper-class students who live in your community and will assist you in your own transition to Lehigh. They can answer questions, help you navigate campus resources, and support your academic, personal, and social transition to campus. They also foster meaningful connections among residents by facilitating programs and experiences that build community. Additionally, Gryphons uphold community standards and University policies to ensure your residential space remains respectful, safe, and conducive to learning. They are a peer leader who is an important part of your first-year living on campus.

### Our Professional Staff Team

In addition to Gryphons, professional staff of the Office of Residence Life live on campus and provide leadership and oversight for the residential community. Assistant Directors supervise and support the Gryphon staff while overseeing the day-to-day operations of their residential areas. Our ADs work together with the Gryphons to cultivate residential communities that are inclusive, engaging, and aligned with the University's values. They provide guidance, respond to concerns, and hold community members accountable when expectations are not met. A professional staff member is on duty every day to respond to urgent concerns or emergencies, ensuring timely support is always available.



### Lehigh Dining Services

Lehigh Dining offers the most extensive dining portfolio in the Lehigh Valley. Our team is committed to providing the Lehigh community with an extraordinary dining experience at our two custom-designed student restaurants, ten retail locations, three food trucks, an Amazon Just Walk Out Store, and a 24/7 self-serve micromart. #### Meal Plans

First-year students can choose from three meal plans. The unlimited plan, All Access 7, includes 5 guest swipes. The 240 Block Plan, the default plan, includes 3 guest swipes. The 220 Block Plan does not have guest swipes.

#### Meal Exchanges

A Meal Exchange expands the flexibility of your meal plan. In exchange for a meal swipe, you can purchase special meal combos, called Meal Deals, at retail locations across campus. Meal Deals vary between locations, and offer a variety of food options to suit your needs.

#### Dining Dollars

Dining Dollars work as a separate debit account that you access through your Lehigh ID and can use at any Lehigh Dining Services location. The amount of Dining Dollars deposited into your account roll over from fall to spring semester. Any unused funds in your account at the end of spring semester are forfeited. You may add Dining Dollars to your account anytime using the “Add Dining Dollars” link on the dining homepage at [lehighdining.com](http://lehighdining.com).

#### Student Support

Our full-time, on-campus registered dietitian is a great resource to help students achieve personal dietary goals or guidance with special diets. Lehigh Dining also offers nutrition support, education and programs throughout the entire year that are confidential and free. ## PRELUSSION ... Lehigh's Pre-Orientation Experiences

PreLUision, a collection of ten optional pre-orientation programs, is designed to jump-start your college experience! With a variety of programs offered, preLUision welcomes you to campus before Orientation begins and allows you to connect to Lehigh by engaging with a smaller community of students and staff who share similar interests.

Participating in preLUision will help you:

- Make friends before Orientation begins
- Become familiar with campus and the local community
- Explore an area of interest and how to get involved at Lehigh
- Meet upper-class students, staff and faculty members

PreLUision begins on Monday, August 17, 2026, three days before the rest of the first-year class arrives. While each program is different, they do share some common elements. During the day, faculty, staff and upperclassmen will lead you in a variety of activities based on your program theme. At night, all participants whose program stays at Lehigh attend social events to meet the students in the other preLUision programs. PreLUision programs have been intentionally planned by Lehigh staff, faculty and students, so **participants will need to make arrangements to attend the entire program**. And honestly, you won't want to miss any of the action!

### preLUision Move-In

Students who register for a preLUision program will receive a confirmation with specific program details and move-in information. **Please don't make travel arrangements until you receive your confirmation email.** Check-in will be at

Iacocca Hall from 8:00am–10:30am. You will move into your fall housing assignment in the morning and your program will begin at 12:00pm. Your schedule will be packed, so you'll say goodbye to family and visitors then.

### Early Arrival Programs

*Students participating in International Student Orientation, the Lehigh University Summer Scholars Institute (LUSSI), ROTC, and the Marching 97 Band Camp CANNOT participate in preLUision due to conflicting dates. Please refer to your program director for details on your arrival timeline.*

### Registration

**PreLUision registration will go live May 12 at 3:00pm EDT and will close on June 30.** The link can be found on the Summer Checklist and our website. Each preLUision program has a limited number of spaces and sign-up is on a first-come, first-served basis. To register you will need your Lehigh ID Number (LIN).

### PreLUision Costs and Scholarships

Program costs vary based on the activities each program hosts. If you need assistance in covering the cost of a preLUision program, scholarships are available based on financial need. **Scholarship applications will open May 1 and are available at [go.lehigh.edu/prelusion](https://go.lehigh.edu/prelusion).**

C.L.I.M.B. is designed to help you build meaningful connections before classes even begin — through mentorship, shared experiences, and intentional community-building.

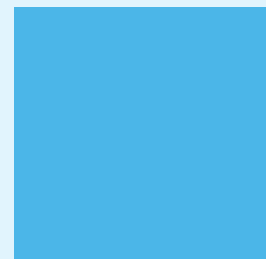
### During this experience, you'll have the opportunity to:

- **Explore Campus & Community — Together:** Through on- and off-campus activities, including a group trip to Dorney Park, participants build relationships with peers and mentors while exploring the broader Lehigh and Bethlehem community together.

As an incoming CSB (Computer Science and Business) honors program student you may have questions about how an intercollege program works. Throughout your 3 day preLUision experience, we will introduce you to the ins and outs of CSB as well as resources available to make your time at Lehigh successful. You will also embark on a journey that will help you get acclimated to college academics and college life.

- Connect with fellow incoming CSB students as well as more seasoned current student mentors that will become your support system for years to come.
- Engage in hands-on activities in Computer Science, Business and many other areas of the University that will help build foundations as you transition into college life.
- Meet the Leadership teams and some faculty from both colleges as well as other important people and resources across campus
- Navigate Lehigh during a campus wide scavenger hunt where you can win prizes and various other activities.
- Explore the local food scene with dishes from nearby restaurants, get to know your neighborhood, and dive into an evening of games and great eats at a local hotspot.

## FABRICATE: LU

Are you a “Maker” or aspiring to be one? Want to get a jump start on learning to use all of Lehigh’s available state-of-the-art resources for prototyping or designing? Well, then this is the preLUision program for you. Use Lehigh’s 3D printing resources to build a custom keepsake, or cut through steel with the waterjet as you become proficient using these tools that are not only fun but will become a resource for the rest of your stay at Lehigh! Laser cutters? We have that! CNC Machining? Yep, we have that! Oh, and the swag that allows you to proudly proclaim you participated in Fabricate:LU? We will MAKE that — a custom t-shirt, water bottle, and more. Interspersed will be a little healthy competition to help get you motivated!

As part of this intensive, exciting foray into making, students will:

- Explore traditional methods of work, such as bending sheet metal to give it form
- Learn to harness the powers of programming and electronics with an arduino microcontroller
- Get exposed to the exciting technology of 3D printing by designing and printing components of your project
- Use the laser cutter, waterjet, t-shirt printer, vinyl cutter, and more to enhance your immersive experience
- Explore the local area and learn the history of an old manufacturing city all the while enjoying the culinary delights found in Bethlehem
- Experience the thrill of taking disparate components made with a wide variety of skills, and combining them into a final, functional, tool to compete against fellow participants.

No special skills, abilities, or experience is necessary! Join us and we’ll teach you.

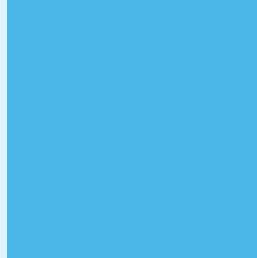

## LEHIGH360: FIND YOUR WHY

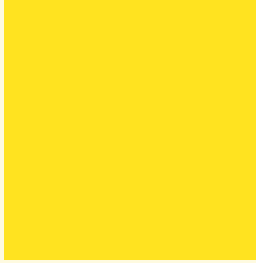

## LEHIGH WOMEN ENGINEERS

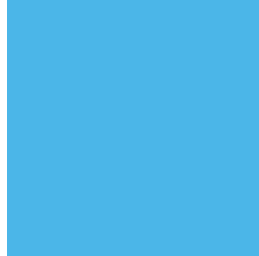

## ORIENTATION ... *your introduction to Lehigh*

### Moving In

First-year students will move in on **Thursday, August 20, 2026** between 8:00am–11:30am. First, you will check-in for Orientation at Iacocca Hall on the Mountaintop Campus and receive your Orientation materials, group information, and directions to your residence hall. **You must keep all of these materials with you throughout Orientation.**

Each residence hall will have specific directions to take you down the mountain to unload your belongings. **You must check in for Orientation first at Iacocca in order to receive your room keys at the entrance of your residence hall.** Specific directions to Iacocca Hall are on the OFYE website and will be emailed to you later this summer. Go light on the packing. It's easier to add things to your room after you are settled than to have a tower of belongings stacked next to your bed!

### Orientation

You will be assigned to a small group led by one of our 90 upper-class Orientation Leaders (OLs). You can meet the OLs on the OFYE Instagram this summer! The OLs represent all that Lehigh has to offer, including a variety of different majors, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, and student involvement opportunities. They will lead discussions on the transition from high school to college, introduce you to the resources available to you as a Lehigh student, and share their experiences navigating the college environment.

During Orientation, you will:

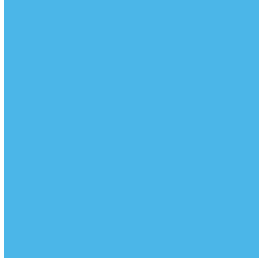

The Monday Orientation will contain the same sessions and content, so there is no need to come back later in the week! Times will vary slightly from the Thursday schedule. After Family Orientation ends around 5:30pm you can tell your family they are welcome to leave campus and head for home! Your schedule is so packed during Orientation that you won't have time to hang out with them once you get started.

### Summer Webinar Series

The summer webinar series will occur throughout the summer starting in late May. It will be a virtual series to introduce families to a variety of campus resources, provide support on discussions that may be helpful before students' arrival, and to introduce campus partners and administrators who will be instrumental in a student's transition and success. The schedule will be released later in May on the website and through email.

## NavigateLU

Being a Lehigh student means you are involved, engaged, and active in your learning experiences. In this fall semester program, you will set goals, develop an action plan, and take the crucial first steps along your pathway to success. You will build purposeful connections — with people and to resources — to enhance your Lehigh experience.

You set the course and direct where you are headed, and these individuals will collaborate with you by asking good questions and aiding you in finding the resources that will lead you to success.

### Program Requirements

- **Meet individually with faculty/staff coaches at least twice.** Check-in, set goals, and reflect on your experiences and path at Lehigh. These meetings will encourage thoughtful reflection on the bLUeprint 5 Foundations and learning from first-year programming.
- **Meet with your Orientation Leader and group at least once.** Connect with your peers to talk about the campus experience and how it's really going now that you've been here for a few weeks.
- **Attend 5×10 programming.** Choose 5 programs from a calendar of events that interest you and will enhance your success.

### The 5x10

To help begin your journey of curiosity and exploration, we created the 5×10 programming series. We expect all first-year students to attend five programs — one for each of the Five Foundations — in the first ten weeks of the semester. During the first ten weeks of college, you will begin to develop new routines, create new social connections and begin to establish your place at Lehigh. The 5×10 programming series is a way to expose you to

the multitude of opportunities that exist at Lehigh, and encourage you to reflect on those opportunities so you can maximize your experiences. A few examples from last year include:

- Coffee and Cosmetics: Chemical Engineering Consumer Products
- Did Kendrick Defame Drake? Exploring current events and the law
- Business of Health: Founding & Growing a Startup
- Advancing Learning with Google AI Gemini and NotebookLM
- Conquer Common Hour Exams: Your Ultimate Prep Guide

You will have a chance to complete a 5×10 program during the Friday of Orientation! The Lehigh 5×10 Symposium are hour long workshops where faculty will share their expertise and passions with students.

### How to Select Your Coach

**NavigateLU exists to aid you in your success and is a mandatory program for all first-year students.** However, we want you to have the agency to find programs, staff, faculty, and administrators who might best support you. All of our coaches will share information about themselves that you can review over the summer. In August, you will be given access to a registration page where you can choose an individual who might best serve as a connection and guide for you. After signing up, you will receive email notification from your coach to sign up for meeting times.

### Creating your bLUeprint

At the end of this experience, our hope is that you've learned more about who you are and drafted the start of your bLUeprint — reflecting on and incorporating all that you've learned and how you've grown as an individual!



# CAMP HAWK ... sleep away camp for college students

**September 11-13, 2026**

Whether you went to camp every summer of your childhood or have never been to summer camp before in your life, Camp Hawk is for you! Camp Hawk is Lehigh's version of camp for first year students AFTER classes have already started. It's the perfect opportunity for you to continue making new connections while you indulge your inner camper with classic camp games — like Gaga and the famous IronHawk Competition — and s'mores!

Transitioning to college can be surprisingly hard! Camp Hawk is a great place to talk about the transition, what your Lehigh experience has been like, and explore what it can be.

This two-night retreat experience takes place in the Pocono Mountains and is part of a larger off-campus experience called the Great Pocono Escape, which includes student leaders from various campus organizations. 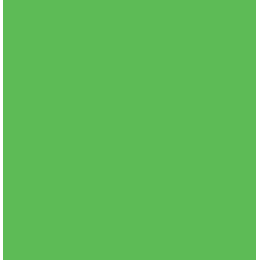


## So how do I sign up?

## COURSE REGISTRATION

Scheduling your classes is one of the most exciting aspects of being a college student! You will be able to register for classes online beginning in mid-July. Throughout the month of June, important updates and information regarding the registration process will be posted on your student portal and will also be sent to your Lehigh University email address. **All official correspondence is sent via email utilizing your Lehigh University issued email address. Students are expected to check their University email regularly.**

### Advising

By the middle of June, a Lehigh staff member in your advising unit will reach out to you via your Lehigh email address. They will remind you of resources available to you and offer to assist you as you explore and decide which courses you should register for. There will be virtual advising sessions and webinars available during June. Check your Lehigh email address and the portal for specific details. Colleges and programs may approach advising differently over the summer, but there is always someone to help.

### Preparing for Registration

To prepare for the process, check out the university catalog ([catalog.lehigh.edu](http://catalog.lehigh.edu)), college information on Connect Lehigh, and the First-Year Student Enrollment website available May 22, ([fysenroll.lehigh.edu](http://fysenroll.lehigh.edu)) for information and helpful links!

### AP Scores

Don't forget to send your AP scores! Your scores are needed in advance to help you register for the appropriate level of a course once registration is available. AP scores will not have a negative impact on your student record in

any way, so please don't hesitate to send everything. This is the best way to ensure that you receive all of the credit you deserve. You will be able to see which scores you requested to be sent to us by logging into your College Board account ([collegeboard.org](http://collegeboard.org)), and which scores we received by viewing your academic transcript through Banner. Scores are not released prior to July 1, and we anticipate having credit on student records within a week. More information on your AP scores will be provided as we get closer to starting the registration process.

### What To Do When...

- **Deciding which courses to take?** Review your course registration guide, Connect Lehigh and your email for additional information, see the first-year enrollment website for sample schedules, and contact your academic unit.
- **Have questions about utilizing the registration system?** Review the First-Year Enrollment website for videos on how to utilize the registration system and contact the Office of the Registrar.
- **Having trouble during the registration period?** Use the Live Chat on the First-Year Student Enrollment website to talk with someone in the moment.

### Schedule Changes

Still feeling nervous even after you've registered? Don't worry! You will have the opportunity to meet with a college representative on Friday, August 21 during Orientation for any last minute questions and course changes. Students can continue making schedule changes through the first week of the semester, so there's plenty of time to ensure that you have an appropriate course schedule.
