# WELCOME TO LEHIGH!

We know you have a lot on your mind as you prepare to start your college career at Lehigh, so the information in this Welcome Guide is designed to help make this a smooth transition. Be sure to read everything on these pages and then complete the necessary tasks.



## GETTING STARTED

As a new student at Lehigh, there are a few things you need to complete before August. We call it your **Summer Checklist**. Make sure you complete these items. Finishing these tasks on your own, or with a little guidance from us, will help you in the event you have a question when you arrive in the fall.

### Connect Lehigh

Connect Lehigh ([connect.lehigh.edu](https://connect.lehigh.edu)) is your one-stop shop for Lehigh information. To log in, use your Lehigh computing account credentials, the six-character username (e.g., abc123) and the password you established after you were admitted. If you haven't created your Lehigh computing account, go to the Applicant Student Portal and click on the link "Establish your Lehigh Account." If you need assistance, please contact the Information Technology Services Help Desk at 610-758-HELP (4357).

### Summer Checklist

The Summer Checklist is designed to help you keep track of the tasks you need to complete before your arrival. You can check off items as you go and ensure you don't miss any important deadlines. On pages 2 and 3 are a few notes regarding specific checklist items. This is not a complete list! Log into Connect Lehigh for a complete list and to view item deadlines. The checklist will include informational links, required surveys, forms, and contracts. International students will complete an additional pre-arrival checklist through iHome. You should have received this information from the Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS), and questions can be directed to [intnl@lehigh.edu](mailto:intnl@lehigh.edu).

### Lehigh Email

You should have access to your Lehigh Gmail account which is available at [lehigh.edu/google](https://lehigh.edu/google). **All official university communication will ONLY be sent to your Lehigh email.** To login you will utilize the same credentials you do for your portal. In addition to receiving your new Lehigh Gmail account, you will need to enroll in Duo multi factor authentication via the Duo Enrollment Page. **Be sure to complete the entire process outlined in How to Enroll in Duo, at [go.lehigh.edu/studentduoguide](https://go.lehigh.edu/studentduoguide), in one sitting.** Abandoning the process will prevent you from being able to access Lehigh's resources. If you have questions regarding your Lehigh Gmail account, contact the ITS Help Desk.

### The Lehigh Pass

Your Lehigh Pass is a mobile credential that identifies you as a member of the Lehigh community. Lehigh Pass grants you access to your residence hall, academic buildings, athletic events, your meal plan, Clutch Cash account and more. You'll receive more details this summer regarding how to upload your photo and create your Lehigh Pass right on your phone.

### Student Health Information

Visit the checklist for links to the 2026-2027 health forms required to be completed by your healthcare provider. You will need to upload them to your student health portal, and complete any electronic forms, enroll in or waive Lehigh's student health insurance plan and upload a picture of your health insurance card.



## Create your LINC Account

LINC is a “virtual campus center” and the primary location for the Lehigh community to learn about student involvement opportunities. You can search clubs and organizations, print your involvement transcript, and find campus events, so create your account this summer. Instructions are available on the Summer Checklist.

## Packing List

The Summer Checklist links this helpful packing list including what to bring and what not to bring. **If you are shipping items to campus, please note the Mail Center cannot accept packages until August.** Your mailing address will be sent to you via email and can be found in your banner account when it is assigned and available later this summer.

## Transportation & Parking Services

Any car parked on campus must have a valid Lehigh parking permit. **2026–2027 permits will be sold on a first come, first served basis.** You will receive detailed emails with parking location options and pricing for permits with advanced notice of the dates permits will go on sale. Options will vary for residential permits and commuter permits. Commuter permit options also differ by class standing. **Permits will be available for purchase in mid-July at [parking.lehigh.edu](https://parking.lehigh.edu)** for on campus and off-campus student residents.

First-year students commuting to campus are eligible to purchase a Zoellner Garage permit or a Goodman Commuter permit. Upperclassmen students may purchase a Sayre Zone Commuter permit, Goodman Commuter permit or a Mountaintop Commuter permit. The Goodman and Mountaintop campuses are accessible via the on-campus bus routes.

## Connect with Transfer Students

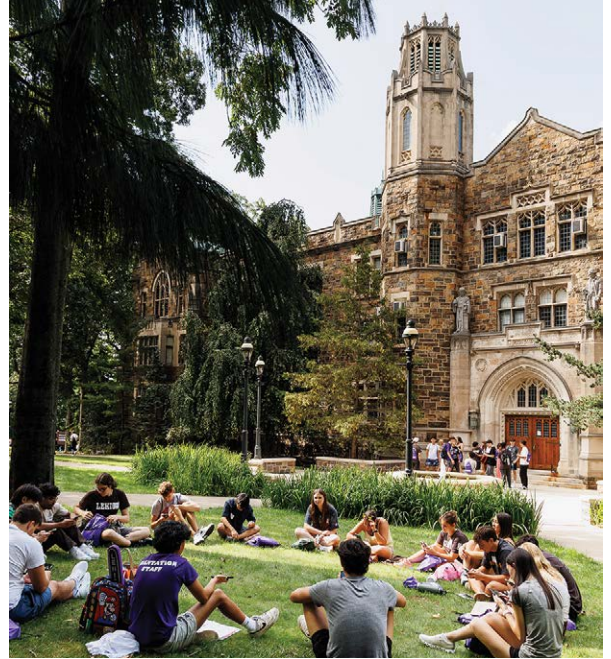

# COURSE REGISTRATION

## Advising

By the middle of June, a Lehigh staff member in your advising unit will reach out to you via your Lehigh email address. They will remind you of resources available to you and offer to assist you as you explore and decide which courses you should register for. There will be virtual advising sessions and webinars available during June. Check your Lehigh email address for specific details. Discuss your intended course load with an academic advisor well in advance to ensure that you have necessary support and guidance. Colleges and programs may approach advising differently over the summer, but there is always someone to help.

## Transfer Credits

Lehigh strives to give the best transfer credit experience possible. To ensure that students are set up for academic success, courses taken at other institutions are evaluated by the appropriate department at Lehigh for equivalent content and rigor. Some courses may count for general credit but not towards your major. For each course that students wish to be reviewed for transfer credit, a syllabus from the previous institution(s) should be provided, to assist with the departmental review process. The Registrar's office serves as the point of contact for the students and faculty during the transfer credit process, and encourages students to reach out with any questions: [ras@lehigh.edu](mailto:ras@lehigh.edu), 610-758-3200, or visit the Registrar's website at [ras.lehigh.edu](https://ras.lehigh.edu) for FAQs and a live chat.

## Schedule Changes

You will have the opportunity to meet with a college representative on Friday, August 21 during Orientation for any last-minute questions and

course changes. Students can continue making schedule changes through the first week of the semester, so there's plenty of time to ensure that you have an appropriate course schedule.

- **Hand Raise** lets you easily request support for what you need.
- **Success Team** organizes your personalized Lehigh contacts in one place.

## Housing

Every student who lives on-campus Lives Lehigh. Your residence hall will be your space on-campus where you sleep, study, and hang out, but also where you will begin to create your new community. It's where you will further explore your identities and better understand identities different from your own. Your residence hall will be one of the first places at Lehigh where you will make an impact on those around you. Lehigh is your community now. So, meet your neighbors. Talk to your Gryphon. Grab a hot drink or a bite to eat with someone you haven't met yet. Choose to Live Lehigh.

## Accommodation Request

If you have a dining, medical or religious accommodation request for housing, go to [go.lehigh.edu/housingaccommodation](https://go.lehigh.edu/housingaccommodation) between May 15 and June 1. This process must be completed before the housing contract opens.

## Housing and Roommate Selection

Learn about the housing contract and roommate selection process at [go.lehigh.edu/trhousing](https://go.lehigh.edu/trhousing). First and second year students are required to live on-campus. The transfer housing process opens June 4 and will be available to you a few days after your Lehigh email address is activated. It is due June 19.

Lehigh assigns rooms based on class year and themed community interests (if applicable). A random process will be utilized to determine your housing assignment along with others who have made similar selections.

## Lehigh Dining Services

Lehigh Dining offers the most extensive dining portfolio in the Lehigh Valley. Our team is committed to providing the Lehigh community with an extraordinary dining experience at our two

## Dining Dollars

Dining Dollars work as a separate debit account that you access through your Lehigh ID and can use at any Lehigh Dining Services location. The amount of Dining Dollars deposited into your account rolls over from fall to spring semester. Any unused funds in your account at the end of spring semester are forfeited. You may add Dining Dollars at any time to your account through [lehighdining.com](https://lehighdining.com).

## Student Support

Our full-time, on-campus registered dietitian is a great resource to help students achieve personal dietary goals or guidance with special diets. ## preLUsion... your pre-orientation experience

### preLUsion

PreLUsion, a collection of ten optional pre-orientation programs, is designed to jump-start your college experience! With a variety of programs offered, preLUsion welcomes you to campus before Orientation begins and allows you to connect to Lehigh by engaging with a smaller community of students and staff who share similar interests.

PreLUsion begins on Monday, August 17, 2026, three days before the rest of the first-year class arrives. While each program is different, they do share some common elements. During the day, faculty, staff and upperclassmen will lead you in a variety of activities based on your program theme. At night, all participants whose program stays at Lehigh attend social events to meet the students in the other preLUsion programs. PreLUsion programs have been intentionally planned by Lehigh staff, faculty and students, so **participants will need to make arrangements to attend the entire program.** And honestly, you won't want to miss any of the action!

### preLUsion Move-In

Students who register for a preLUsion program will receive a confirmation with specific program details and move-in information. **Please don't make travel arrangements until you receive your confirmation email.** Check-in will be at Iacocca Hall from 8:00am–10:30am. If living on campus, you will move into your fall housing assignment

in the morning and your program will begin at 12:00pm. Your schedule will be packed, so you'll say goodbye to family and visitors then.

### Registration

**PreLUsion registration will go live May 12 at 3:00pm EDT and will close on June 30.** The link can be found on the Summer Checklist and our website. Each preLUsion program has a limited number of spaces and sign-up is on a first-come, first-served basis. To register you will need your Lehigh ID Number (LIN).

To find your LIN:

- Go to [go.lehigh.edu/lin](https://go.lehigh.edu/lin) and log in with your Lehigh credentials
- Your LIN is the ID Number located under your name on the left-hand side

### preLUsion Costs & Scholarships

Program costs vary based on the activities each program hosts. If you need assistance in covering the cost of a preLUsion program, scholarships are available based on financial need. **Scholarship applications will open May 1 and are available at [go.lehigh.edu/prelusion](https://go.lehigh.edu/prelusion).** The deadline to apply for a scholarship is June 21.

If your plans change over the summer, refund requests must be made in writing to [fye@lehigh.edu](mailto:fye@lehigh.edu) before June 30. No refund requests will be accepted after June 30, 2026.



## ORIENTATION ... your introduction to Lehigh

Orientation for transfer students is designed to create a similar introductory experience that all new Lehigh students go through, while also fostering an environment for you to meet and get to know other students transferring into Lehigh University. We recognize that you have been to college before. We hope that these programs and conversations help distinguish Lehigh from your previous institution, while not to devalue the growth that has occurred along the way. Transfer students will be placed into a group with other transfer students. These groups will be led by our Transfer Orientation Leaders. The Transfer Orientation Leaders are upper class students that will help guide you through your four-day Orientation experience and can act as a resource as you navigate Lehigh.

During Orientation, you will:

- Learn about campus resources
- Make new connections
- Discuss Lehigh and community expectations
- Learn about academic expectations
- Explore South Bethlehem during Faux Friday

**International Students\*** You are also required to attend the International Student Orientation which begins on Monday, August 17, 2026.

This orientation program is designed to help you:

- Learn about your immigration responsibilities
- Learn campus resources and services specific to international students
- Get tips from current international and domestic students to build a support network on campus

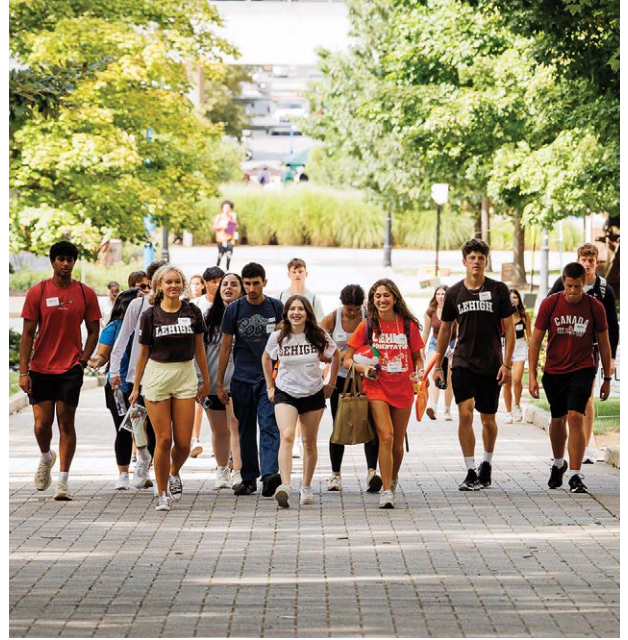

## OFYE Programming

The OFYE offers a variety of programs and resources to support you in your transition to Lehigh after Orientation. The Assistant Director manages social programming and outreach to support you in addressing challenges and building a sense of belonging at Lehigh. Watch out for monthly newsletters with information about campus resources, important reminders, and exciting opportunities.

A few programs to look out for include:

- **Participate in NavigateLU**

Meet individually with a staff member or in a small group with fellow transfer students to set goals, learn about resources, and discuss your transition. This is a great way to get connected to someone who can be a sounding board and a resource for you as you navigate Lehigh. As challenges arise, you'll have someone to turn to who can be a support network and enhance your Lehigh experience.

- **Attend 5x10 programs**

This programming series will expose you to the multitude of opportunities that exist on campus to enhance and maximize your Lehigh experience. We encourage all students to attend 5 programs in the first 10 weeks of the semester - one for each of the Five Foundations. In the first ten weeks of the semester, you begin to develop new routines, create new social connections and establish your place at Lehigh. Get your semester started off on the right foot.

- **Register for Camp Hawk**

Camp Hawk is Lehigh's version of summer camp for students AFTER classes have started. It's the perfect opportunity for you to continue making new connections while you indulge your inner camper with classic camp games during the famous IronHawk Competition and s'mores! It's a great place to talk about the transition, what your Lehigh experience has been like, and explore what it can be. Camp Hawk will be held September 11– 13. ## FAMILY RESOURCES

### Family Orientation

Like you, we know that your family is going through an adjustment. To help answer your family's questions and provide them some additional resources, we offer a one day Family Orientation. Even if your family has already attended orientation at a different institution, it's a great way to learn more about Lehigh and the resources we offer you. It is held on either:

- **Monday, August 17**—Ideal for families of students participating in the Marching Band, a preLUision program, LUSI, ROTC or International Student Orientation.
- **Thursday, August 20**—This program is open to all families.

The Monday Orientation will contain the same sessions and content, so there is no need to come back later in the week! Times will vary slightly from the Thursday schedule. Please see the Office of First-Year Experience website ([go.lehigh.edu/FYfamilies](http://go.lehigh.edu/FYfamilies)) for the final schedule in July.

After Family Orientation ends around 5:30pm you can tell your parents and family they are welcome to leave campus and head for home! Your schedule is so packed during Orientation that you won't have time to hang out with them once you get started.

### Summer Webinar Series

The summer webinar series will occur throughout the summer starting in May. It will be a virtual series to introduce families to a variety of campus resources, provide support on discussions that

may be helpful before students' arrival, and to introduce campus partners and administrators who will be instrumental in a student's transition and success.

### Summer Emails

In your application for admission to Lehigh, you likely gave us contact information for a parent or family member. They should receive emails approximately every two weeks from the Office of First-Year Experience over the summer. They will not receive every email or be given access to your checklist, but we will try to keep them aware and informed throughout the summer as you get prepared for your college transition.
